# What are the most important things that you learned in this course? Please reflect on the knowledge and skills you gained.

Comments

To appreciate film

I really gained a new appreciation for how film is put together, the thought process behind it, and its ability to distinguish itself from other mediums.

The week on color included the most interesting materials. I also liked the Sontag and the Montage readings.

History and contours of cinematic studies as a humanistic discipline.

Terminology, I probably knew or understood most of the concepts but putting words to them made it easier to discuss them.

About the importance of using color

I wouldn't say there was any specific important things I learned, so much as I got a lot of exposure to different kinds of cinema, as well as the tools needed to think critically about a lot of different techniques to be used.






#### Is this class a requirement of some sort?




### Prior to starting this class, your interest level was?




### Now that this class is over, your interest is?




## Why did you choose to take this course? (Select all that apply)
